The project output will inform priorities for developing a joint plan for the Betsi Kenya Link for the next 3 years.	£3,000

The aim is to build the ability of community members to provide first aid treatment to communities in Thaba Tseka district, where it is often challenging and time-consuming to reach a health facility. The school needs new buildings to allow it to grow and provide places for up to 300 pupils under the age of 12. The grant will assist the travel costs for 10 young engineers to travel out to Uganda in pairs for 2 weeks, to supervise construction of Phase 1 of the school using local labour and help in the development of Wales based Engineers as they work towards professional qualifications.	£5,000
